In Memory of Dr. King Heiple



his past March Orange Community Education was saddened to learn of the death of our long-time woodworking volunteer, Dr. Kingsbury Heiple. "King," as he liked to be called, was a weekly fixture in our Tuesday evening woodworking class, helping students with the proper use of the lathe and chisels for woodturning projects, as well as assisting students with cabinet making. Dr. Heiple was known internationally, not only for his woodworking skills, but

not only for his woodworking skills, but as an expert Skeet shooter. He was elected to the National Skeet Shooting Association Hall of Fame and authored

the book, <u>Mastering Skeet</u>. Before his retirement, Dr. Heiple was the chair of the Department of Orthopedics at Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and University Hospitals and an internationally known researcher and clinician in orthopedics.

For everyone in the Tuesday evening woodworking class, King was a renowned teacher, mentor and friend. Rest in peace, King. We will always remember you, we miss you, and we thank you for your kindness and service to our students.

The instructor is Elizabeth Latimer, a registered Yoga instructor. Elizabeth's teaching style is informative and caring, with a mix of humor.

Each week will begin with 15 minutes of fun, kid-friendly Yoga to provide physical activity, followed by 45 minutes of Meditation exercises. The curriculum for Week 1 includes the Yoga portion, with introductions, breathing exercises, gentle stretching, sun salutation and standing positions. The Meditation portion includes an introduction to meditation and the benefits, followed by a guided seated meditation, exercise break, meditation to music, lying on the side meditation, exercise break, progressive relaxation in a lying down position, and a closing which includes how to practice yoga and meditation at home.
