ORANGE EARLY CHILDHOOD

Orange Early Childhood is a program of the Orange Community Education & Recreation department, under the auspices of the Orange Board of Education. The center is located in the Pepper Pike Learning Center on the Orange City Schools campus. The Orange Early Childhood Center is a comprehensive program providing classes and activities for children ages 2-5. The center offers toddler and preschool classes with a variety of scheduling options. The Early Childhood program also offers enrichment classes, a summer camp program and Safety Town. PRESCHOOL & TODDLER PROGRAM

Monday - Fridays | 7:00am - 6:00pm

The program has been in operation for 40 years and offers a high-quality, developmentally appropriate curriculum that aligns with Ohio's Early Learning and Development Standards, focusing on Social-Emotional Development, Approaches to Learning, Physical Well-Being and Motor Development, Cognitive Development and General Knowledge and Language and Literacy Development. The program is also accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), one of seven percent of Early Childhood programs nationwide.

The toddler and preschool experience is further enhanced with specialized programming including story time with a children's librarian from the Orange Branch Library, music class with a music specialist from the Beck Center for the Performing Arts and nutrition, wellness and fitness programming through Stretch-N-Grow. In addition, we offer numerous field trips and special visitors throughout the school year. The program also boasts a fully-stocked children's library. Children enrolled in our program also have the option to participate in a wide variety of additional enrichment classes (featured in this brochure).

PROGRAM OPTIONS

EARLY PRESCHOOL FOR TWOS

This program is for children that turn two by June 30th, 2017. The Early Preschool Program is geared to create a foundation for the early education years. Special focus will be placed on learning fundamental concepts, developing social skills and becoming acclimated to a school setting. Children do not need to be potty-trained to enroll in the Early Preschool Program, although this will be worked on throughout the year.

PRESCHOOL FOR THREES

This program is for children that turn three by September 30th, 2017. The Preschool Program is geared to build on the foundation set in our Early Preschool Program. The Preschool Program provides hands-on and engaging activities that promote cognitive, social, physical and language development. Children must be potty-trained to enroll in the Preschool Program.



PRE-KINDERGARTEN FOR FOURS

This program is for children that turn four by September 30th, 2017. The Pre-Kindergarten Program is geared to extend the foundation set in our Preschool Program. Special focus will be placed on building and enhancing skills in all academic areas and gaining self-control, confidence and independence necessary to be prepared for Kindergarten.

YOUNG FIVES

This program is for children that turn five by December 31st, 2017. The Young Fives Program is geared for children that miss the age cut-off for Kindergarten or for children that could benefit from an additional year of skill-building. The Young Fives Program is structured to run just like a typical Kindergarten classroom. This program is traditionally offered as a full-day, 5 day per week program.

PICKING UP FROM CLASSES



A parent or guardian must fill this out for swimmers under 18 years of age. Please bring exact change, Master Card, Visa, Discover or checks made out to the Orange Board of Education.

Children ages 4 and younger are free only when accompanied by a paid adult. Only two children ages 4 and under per paying adult allowed. Parents must remain within arms length of all children 4 and under.

The family rate is for parents or guardians and their children who reside in the same household (anyone you can claim on your federal income tax). Extended family, such as cousins and grandchildren, are not considered as part of the family rate. Also, nannies, babysitters, friends and neighbors must be paid for individually.

Children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by a responsible adult 18 years or older.

Please arrive no earlier than 5 minutes prior to the scheduled activity and exit the locker rooms/pool area no later than 10 minutes past the scheduled ending time for the activity.

Lifeguards may remove weak/non-swimmers from the pool to avoid dangerous situations.

The diving boards will only be open during pool parties and on the 1st Saturday of the month.

Additional rules apply; please see posted rules at the facility. Lifeguards are present for your safety; please follow the instructions of lifeguards quickly.
