SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

The quickest and most convenient way to ensure your camper is enrolled is to use our new online registration system at www.OrangeRec.com. All camps have enrollment limits. Please register early to ensure a space!

- For Residents: Online registration begins Saturday, February 10 at 9:00am at www.OrangeRec.com. For those residents needing assistance in registering, OCER staff will be available at the Pepper Pike Learning Center from 9:00am-12:00pm on Saturday, February 10.
- For Non-Residents: Online Non-Resident registration begins Monday, February 12 at 9:00am at www.OrangeRec.com. For those needing assistance in registering, OCER staff will be available at the Pepper Pike Learning Center during regularly scheduled day and evening hours.
- Waiting List: As camps fill, please be sure to put your name on the waiting list. Should space becomes available you will be called. Residents will be given priority over non-residents once on the waiting list.

NOTE: Please register your child for the grade in which they are currently enrolled for this school year ending June 2018.

PAYMENT PLAN AVAILABLE

A Summer Camp Payment Plan is available for resident and non-resident families enrolling in any camp priced \$99 or more. The first half of payment is due at time of registration and the remaining balance is due on April 20, 2018. If the balance is not paid in full by April 20, your child's spot in that program will be forfeited and your deposit will be returned to you.

OUT OF TOWN GUESTS? GRANDCHILD VISITING?

If you are planning on having an out of town visitor - grandchild, niece, nephew or friend - for a one or two day visit this summer, you may register your guest for the Orange Lions Camp, Sports Camp or Stagecrafters Theatre Camp for \$36/day plus any field trip fees. Arrangements must be made with the camp director in advance, based on availability.

TRANSPORTATION & LATE PICK UP CHARGE

Parents provide transportation to and from all camps. Parents are asked to comply with a formal traffic pattern, which is strictly enforced for drop-off and pick-up at camps. Campers who are not picked up within 10 minutes after camp dismissal will be supervised by camp staff and will be charged \$1 for every minute which is payable upon pick-up of child.

BEFORE & AFTER CAMP PROGRAM: OPEN DOOR

The Open Door before and after camp program is available for campers attending Orange Lions Camp, Sports Camp, and Stagecrafters Theatre Camp. Open Door is also available before and after most Sports & Enrichment Camps for the week of June 11-15 and July 30-August 3. Our Open Door program operates from 7:00am-6:00pm. See Open Door Camp Program for details.

DEADLINES AND REFUND POLICY

Please take advantage of our early bird pricing by enrolling before April 13. For those enrolling in the optional payment plan, final balance payments are due on April 20. Camp refunds are subject to a \$25 processing fee.

EARLY CHILDHOOD DAY CAMPS

ORANGE EARLY CHILDHOOD

Orange Early Childhood is a program of the Orange Community Education & Recreation department, under the auspices of the Orange Board of Education. The center is located in the Pepper Pike Learning Center on the Orange City School campus. The Orange Early Childhood Center is a comprehensive program providing classes and activities for children ages 2-5. The center offers toddler and preschool classes with a variety of scheduling options, including half-day, full-day and extended care (between 7:00am and 6:00pm). The Early Childhood program also offers enrichment classes and a summer camp program. The Early Childhood office can be reached at (216) 831-4909, Monday-Friday from 8:30am-5:00pm.

2018 ORANGE EARLY CHILDHOOD SUMMER ENRICHMENT CAMPS

Orange Early Childhood is pleased to offer a variety of One Week Enrichment Camps this summer, in addition to an 8 Week Extended Day Camp. Each camp is thoughtfully designed with a combination of fun and educational activities for children ages 3-5 (children must be fully potty-trained). Classes will be divided by age group (preschool/entering Kindergarten). Each camp also includes snacks, field trips and swimming. All campers will also receive an Orange Early Childhood Summer Camp T-shirt. Registration for Early Childhood Camps begins Saturday, February 10th. Full enrollment packets (including what to bring each day) will be mailed home prior to the beginning of camp.

PAYMENT PLAN AVAILABLE

A payment plan is available for Pick 5, Pick All 7 & Extended Day Camp. A Summer Camp Payment Plan Application Form must be completed at registration. The last day to register with a payment plan is March 9th. A \$100 non-refundable deposit per child is due at the time of registration. Half of the remaining balance will be due on May 11 and the other half will be due on June 8.

Children will visit the following community places to learn more about each topic: Playground World, the Fire & Police Station, and the Orange High School Pool. All participants will receive a detailed packet of information prior to the first day. No refunds will be issued for Safety Town.

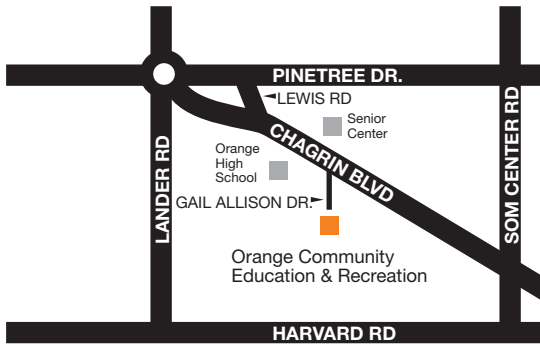
