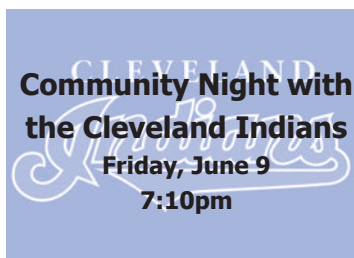

Orange Early Childhood is a program of the Orange Community Education & Recreation department, under the auspices of the Orange Board of Education. The center is located in the Pepper Pike Learning Center on the Orange City School campus. The Orange Early Childhood Center is a comprehensive program providing classes and activities for children ages 2-5. The center offers toddler and preschool classes with a variety of scheduling options. The Early Childhood program also offers enrichment classes and a summer camp program. To reach someone from the Early Childhood Department, call (216) 831-4909, Monday-Friday from 7:30am-5:00pm.

PRESCHOOL & TODDLER PROGRAM

The program has been in operation for 40 years and offers a high-quality, developmentally appropriate curriculum that aligns with **Ohio's Early Learning and Development Standards, focusing on Social-Emotional Development, Approaches to Learning, Physical Well-Being and Motor Development, Cognitive Development and General Knowledge and Language and Literacy Development.** The program is also accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children, one of the seven percent of Early Childhood programs nationwide.

Our program features specialized programming including story time **with a children's librarian from the Orange Branch Library**, music class with a music specialist from the Beck Center for the Performing Arts and nutrition, wellness and fitness programming through Stretch-N-Grow. In addition, we offer numerous field trips and special visitors throughout the school year and the school features a brand **new children's library.** Children enrolled in our program also have the option to participate in a wide variety of additional enrichment classes.

2017-2018 REGISTRATION INFORMATION

PROGRAM OPTIONS

Early Preschool for Twos

This program is for children who turn two by June 30th, 2017. The Early Preschool Program is geared to create a foundation for the early education years. Special focus will be placed on learning fundamental concepts, developing social skills and becoming acclimated to a school setting. Children do not need to be potty-trained to enroll in the Early Preschool Program, although this will be worked on throughout the year.

Preschool for Threes

This program is for children who turn three by September 30th, 2017. The Preschool Program is geared to build on the foundation set in our Early Preschool Program. The Preschool Program provides hands-on and engaging activities that promote cognitive, social, physical and language development. Children must potty-trained to enroll in the Preschool Program.



Pre-Kindergarten for Fours

This program is for children who turn four by September 30th, 2017. The Pre-Kindergarten Program is geared to extend the foundation set in our Preschool Program. Special focus will be placed on building and enhancing skills in all academic areas and gaining the self-control, confidence and independence necessary to be prepared for Kindergarten.

Young Fives

This program is for children that turn five by December 31st, 2017. The Young Fives Program is geared for children that miss the age cut-off for Kindergarten or for children that could benefit from an additional year of skill-building. The Young Fives Program is structured to run similar to a Kindergarten classroom. This program is a full-day, 5 day per week program.

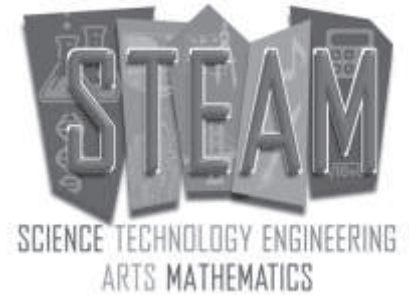

Open Door is the extended day activity program for students in grades K-5. Open Door is a self-supporting program of the Orange Community Education & Recreation Department. The curriculum focuses on social and recreational activities. Designed to provide children with a choice of developmentally appropriate activities, children learn healthy social skills as well as enjoy sports, crafts and games in a safe, welcome, relaxed after school environment.

Please call Debbie Zimmerman, Open Door Supervisor, at 216-831-8605 for information regarding fees and schedules. Daily and monthly plans are available. Open Door registration is ongoing throughout the year as long as space is available. Enrollment is limited. One week prior to first attendance, children must be registered with a completed registration packet on file and fees paid.

The Green Door – After School Program

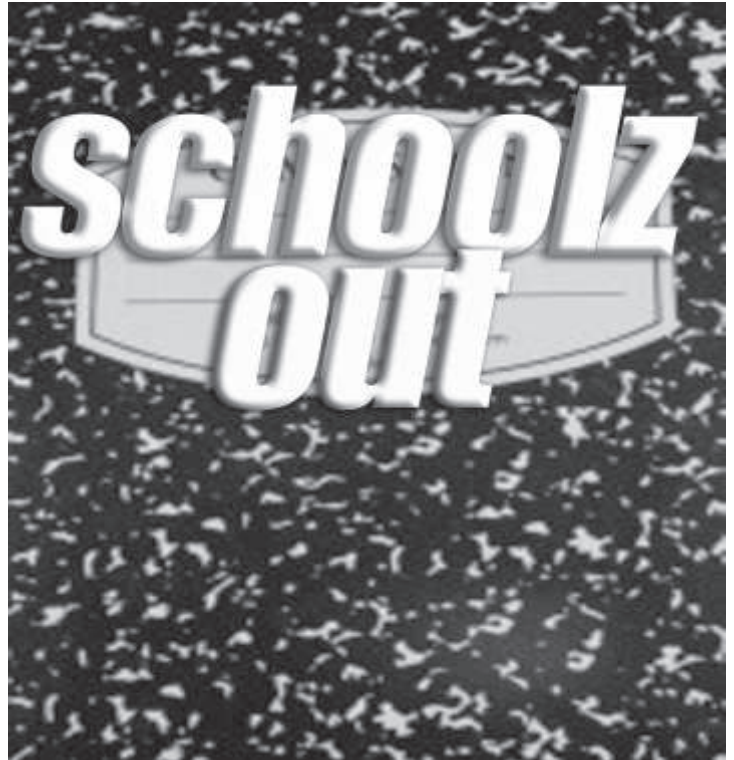
