SUMMER CAMP INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Resident registration begins Saturday, March 4 from 9:00am-12:00pm at our Spring/ Summer Registration Fair in the Pepper Pike Learning Center. We will also begin accepting online registration beginning at 9:00am at www.orangerec.com. Camp Directors will be on hand to answer questions and assist with registration. Non-Residents may begin registering on Monday, March 6 at 9:00am. Registration will continue through Friday, May 12, 5:00pm (Camp Registration Deadline).

You may register online at www.orangerec.com, by emailing your registration form to RecInfo@orangecsd.org, or by faxing your form to 216.831.4209. You may also register in person at the Orange Community Education and Recreation offices located in the Pepper Pike Learning Center Mondays-Thursdays from 9:00am-8:00pm, Fridays from 9:00am-5:00pm and Saturdays from 9:00am-1:00pm.

All camps have enrollment minimums and maximums. Please register early to ensure a space! If a camp is full, please be sure to put your name on the waiting list. If space becomes available and we can accommodate your child, you will be called. Residents will be given priority over non-residents once on the waiting list.

NOTE: Please register your child **using their current grade** for this school year ending June 2017.

REFUND POLICY

Since camp groups and the decision to employ and train staff are based on enrollment, *camp fees are non-refundable*. In the event of a sudden illness or injury, please speak with your Camp Director. We will attempt to modify and make accommodations to meet the needs of your child. A medical refund may be considered, minus a \$25 processing fee, only upon receipt of a written report from your primary care physician. No exceptions, please.

PAYMENT PLAN AVAILABLE

A Summer Camp Payment Plan is available for resident and non-resident campers enrolling in any camp priced \$99 or more. In order to take advantage of the Camp Payment Plan, you must register for camp and the payment plan at the Spring/Summer Activity & Camp Registration Fair on Saturday, March 4 from 9:00am -12:00pm or on Monday, March 6 from 9:00am-8:00pm at the Pepper Pike Learning Center. Payment plans are not available after Monday, March 6, 2017. No exceptions, please. For more information about the payment plan and for the application form, visit our website at www.orangerec.com.

OUT OF TOWN GUESTS? GRANDCHILD VISITING?

If you are planning on having an out of town visitor - grandchild, niece, nephew or friend - for a one or two day visit this summer, you may register your guest only for the Orange Lions Camp, Sports Camp or Stagecrafters Theatre Camp for \$36/day plus any field trip fees. Arrangements must be made with the camp director in advance based on availability.

TRANSPORTATION & LATE PICK UP CHARGE

Parents provide transportation to and from all camps. Parents are asked to comply with a formal traffic pattern, which is strictly enforced for drop-off and pick-up at camps. In the event of a personal emergency, campers who are not picked up within 10 minutes after camp dismissal will be supervised by camp staff and will be charged \$1 for every minute which is payable upon pick-up of child.

BEFORE & AFTER CAMP PROGRAM

The Open Door before and after camp program is available for *children entering kindergarten up to students completing fifth grade in June 2017* attending Orange Lions Camp, Stagecrafters, Sports Camp and most Sports & Enrichment Camps for the week of June 12-16 and July 31-August 4. Our Open Door program operates from 7:00am-6:00pm (except when camp is in session). See Open Door Camp Program for details.

OPEN DOOR BEFORE & AFTER CAMP PROGRAM

The Open Door program is available for children entering kindergarten in September 2017 up to students completing fifth grade in June 2017. The Open Door morning program opens at 7:00am at the Pepper Pike Learning Center and Open Door staff will walk your camper to their appropriate camp program. The after camp program runs until 6:00pm at the Orange outdoor pool/Orange High School. Open Door is available before and/or after Orange Lions Camp, Stagecrafters Camp, Sports Camp, full day Sports and Enrichment Camps and the half day camps when combined for a full day during the weeks of June 12-16, July 31-Aug.4 and for full days during the weeks of June 12-16 and July 31-Aug.4. The week of Aug. 7-11, enroll in our NEW WEEK of Adventure Camp from 9:00am-3:00pm. After camp can be added for children to stay until 6:00 p.m. Before camp is not available this week.

The program is coordinated by the Open Door Supervisor, Debbie Zimmerman, who works with her school year staff and supplemental camp staff to provide this before and after camp program that includes choices of sports, games, arts & crafts and swimming. Children are escorted by staff to and from Open Door and school age camps. Open Door is closed August 18. **Deadline to guarantee enrollment for Summer Open Door Before & After Camp Care is May 12.**

NOTE: Online registration *is* available for the new full and partial session specials - You must complete a calendar schedule and include all fees to be considered registered when paying the daily rate. The information in your camp registration packet will also be used for Open Door. All necessary forms and summer calendars will be available at the time of registration. Forms are also available to download at www.orangerec.com or by calling the Open Door office at 216-831-8605. All summer fees for Open Door must be paid in advance.

When using the daily fee option, there will be a \$5.00 change fee for each schedule changes and a \$10.00 fee for each change not received by the preceding Thursday. Current families paying monthly may continue monthly payments when registering through the Open Door office (i.e. payment in May for June attendance, payment in June for July/August attendance)
